- Born in Erfurt, Germany in 1963
- Study of architecture at the Technical University Dresden until 1989
- Postgraduate study in Moscow at the MARCHI Institute from 1989 until 1990
- Assistant at the faculty of architecture of the TU Dresden until 1991
- Foundation of the Association of Architects Milde + Moeser in 1991- CEO of this company; responsible for office management, project management and project co-ordination.
- Foundation of the Institute for protection of historic buildings in 1997
- Joerg Moeser is an internationally acknowledged specialist in European architecture focusing on preparation of complex expert studies for high-grade objects and tasks.
- In addition to his main task of project control and management he was responsible for several historic reconstruction projects of national value, international preservation and urban development projects
- Assignments from various universities dealt with building surveys, building research and architecture in the historical context.
- Further he has experiences in supervision of urban planning and development of historic inner- city areas and heritage sites.
- Under his partnership, a research project was carried out and successfully completed in 1997: "Coverage, Investigation and Evaluation of the Substance of Old City Quarters, especially in the Former GDR".
- Approximately 25 publications dealing with urban development, building history, monumental protection and construction research, have appeared in the course of the last three years.
- He publishes and lectures widely in the field of building research and practical monument protection and revitalization of urban areas and development of historic sites
- Joerg Moeser is a foundation-member of the Institute for Preserving Renovation of Historical Buildings – IBE and co-initiator of the research project "Historical House and Town Research in the Bohemian- Saxonian Area" in co-operation with various universities in the Czech Republic.
